CURRENT CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES

What: Beginning on Monday, June 7, crews will be paving the final layer of asphalt. They will begin on the side streets and will work their way from there. Paving will extend through Thursday, June 10th. Traffic will be shifted at various times during paving. Flaggers will be on site to direct traffic as needed. Please use caution while traveling through 3900 South. Landscape crews will continue to install sod and fencing throughout the week. Concrete pours will occur in various locations for the curb and gutter as well as the curb walls. The radius at 2300 East will also be poured on Saturday. Work on the storm drain at 2300 East will continue and should be complete by Saturday. Crews will complete the installation of the signal sensor loops on Tuesday. Crews will be working through the weekend.

Prior to paving, a layer of tack will be sprayed along the corridor before the asphalt is laid. The tack is extremely sticky and, if driven through, may stick to driveways. Flaggers will be stationed along the corridor to warn residents when the tack is laid so that those who wish to keep their driveways free of the tack, can be aware of it.

Traffic has been shifted to the north side of the roadway and intermittent one-way traffic operations will continue. Left hand turns are unavailable at 2000 East and 2300 East.

Where: Along the entire length of 3900 South, from Honeycut Rd. to 2300 East. Some excavation and milling will extend into the side streets.

Why: To prepare for the new roadway and sidewalks.

When: Road construction will continue through July 2010.

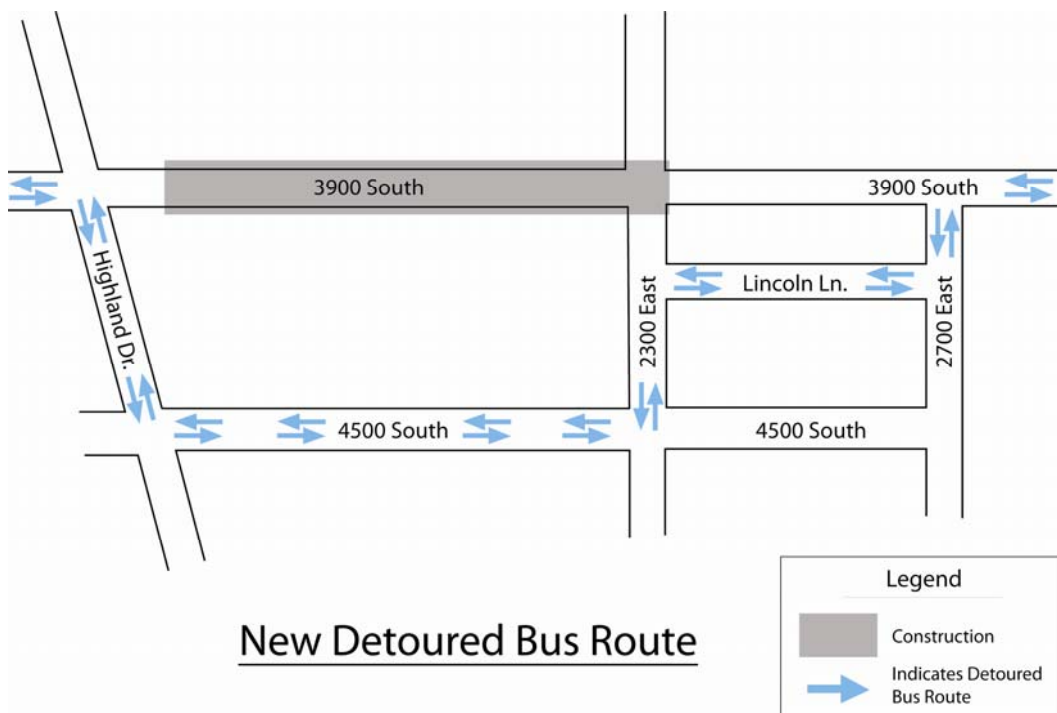
This schedule is subject to change due to weather or equipment related issues.

30 mph Speed Limit: For safety reasons, the enforced speed limit during construction is **30 mph**. Motorists should reduce speeds, be aware of their surroundings, and be prepared to stop at any time.

Mail Delivery: Through the duration of the construction project, the US Post Office will not be delivering mail to the residents and businesses with mailboxes located on 3900 South. Mail will be held at the Holladay Branch, located at 2350 Arbor Lane (approx 4750 South), Salt Lake City, UT 84117. Additional mailboxes will be removed within the next week to facilitate construction on the south side of 3900 South.

Garbage Pick Up: Residents/businesses located on the south side should carry their garbage cans through the portion of the road that is under construction to the edge of the pavement, in line with the orange construction barrels. Trash pick up will continue to be on Tuesdays at 7 am.

UTA Bus Route: For safety reasons, UTA will be redirecting the detour route for route 39 during the length of this project. Buses will use 4500 South from Highland Drive to 2300 East to Lincoln Lane to 2700 East to 3900 South.



Cyclists & Pedestrians: The overall goal of the project is to make 3900 South safer for cyclists, pedestrians and commuters. Although we would like to accommodate cyclists and pedestrians during construction, it is not always feasible. For your safety as a cyclist or pedestrian, please consider an alternate route.
