

MINUTES
EAST MILLCREEK COMMUNITY COUNCIL
Thursday, December 1, 2005

Members present: Kurt Zimmerman, Craig Beck, Robin Bennion, Jay Griffith, John Rideout, Judd Jones and Nate Lavers. Members Excused: Stewart Woodruff and Richard Lee.

The meeting was called to order by Jay Griffith.

The meeting opened with the Pledge of Allegiance led by Jay Griffith.

County Councilman Mark Crockett was not present.

Kurt Zimmerman -- financial report indicated a balance of \$2,370.69. The November/December newsletter cost \$411.61.

Deputy Mike Cupello was present and distributed the monthly crime statistics. In the future they will consist of three separate pages for more clarity (great improvement). In addition, an organizational chart for the Millcreek Precinct Sheriff's Office was made available.

Message from Mayor Corroon's Office -- Ann Ober at long last has returned. Township Special Event funding was approved by County Council. Evergreen Avenue reconstruction is near completion. A new Tree Ordinance is being drafted by Planning and Zoning. Community Council training on Planning and Zoning is scheduled for January 19 in N4017at County Center.

Craig Beck -- Association of Community Councils Together (ACCT) Craig Beck Legislative session will begin in mid January. Salt Lake County has shutdown three culinary wells due to pollution. Free leaf bags are available at the Old Sheriff's substation on 23rd East.

Application to subdivide: Tom Swallow owns property located at 2400 East 3900 South. The property lacks frontage to allow side by side lots without variance. The Planning and Zoning would prefer the "flag lot" approach. Swallow was asking for the Community Council input before proceeding. No vote was taken on the matter.

Millcreek Township's Venture Outdoors Festival 2006 is schedule for June 17th from 3 to 9 p.m. Aimee McConkie distributed a flyer on the festival which emphasizes: education of Township residences about Outdoor Recreation Opportunities, building Community Unity and encouraging Economic Development. A proposed budget was also included.

Robin Bennion -- Millcreek Township General Plan -- the final plan will be available this month.

Evergreen Historical District -- Korral Broschinsky -- Preservation Document Resources spoke on the steps necessary to designate a Historical District. These steps include building a database containing the following info: home with historical and non-historical character, photographs, styles, building materials, age and etc. Homes are classified in classes "a" thru "c" as to historical significance. Historical home must be 50 years or older. A handout was made available.

A discussion was held about a Committee needs to be appointed to handle funds for the Historical District. "Utah Neighborhoods" will be approached to handle the funds to conducting the Historical Survey which would cost approximately \$2,250.00

Five candidates were present to fill the two open East Mill Creek Community Council seats. There are Sally Kaiser, Judy Barnett, Leslie Riddle, Robert Dunfield and Gary Offermann. A special meeting will be held to make the final selection of two persons.

East Mill Creek website was discussed. The last update was in June. A backup person to assist Stewart Woodruff will need to be determined.
